At the National Truck Driving Championships, drivers will take a written examination that tests their knowledge of trucking facts, rules, statistics and safety protocols, look for defects as part of their pre-trip inspection, and complete a difficult driving course. Hosted by the <u>American Trucking Associations</u>, the annual event dates to 1937. The National Truck Driving Championships and the affiliated state truck driving championships are a great incentive for professional truck drivers to operate safely.
